

**ORDINANCE NO. VRSD-105
PRESCRIBING FEES AND CHARGES
FOR THE TOLAND ROAD LANDFILL**

WHEREAS, Ventura Regional Sanitation District (VRSD) is a county sanitation district created pursuant to California Health & Safety Code §4700 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, VRSD operates a solid waste facility known as Toland Road landfill located at 3500 North Toland Road in the unincorporated area of the County of Ventura; and

WHEREAS, California Health & Safety Code §4741.7 and §5471 provide that VRSD may prescribe and collect fees in connection with its refuse disposal facility pursuant to an ordinance adopted by a two-thirds vote of the governing body.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ventura Regional Sanitation District Board of Directors ordains as follows:

Section 1. Short Title. This Ordinance shall be known as the "Toland Road Landfill Fees & Charges Ordinance" and may be cited as such.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of this Ordinance is to establish fees and charges for the Toland Road landfill.

Section 3. Fees and Charges. The following fees and charges are hereby prescribed for the Toland Road landfill:

"Refuse" is all material received for disposal. "Hard-to-Handle" includes bulky or difficult to compact materials, and materials difficult to dispose of, including but not limited to: trees, tree stumps, concrete blocks, large bulky items in excess of three feet in diameter, wire, rope, and fence netting, agricultural plastic film and tape, cable, and those materials which require more than one piece of equipment to handle.

Section 4. Transportation Restriction. Waste transported to the landfill shall be carried by transfer trucks routed from transfer/materials recovery facilities except for waste generated in the cities of Santa Paula and Fillmore and the unincorporated areas of Santa Clara River Valley.

Section 5. Hours of Operation. Normal landfill hours of operation for the general public and hours of operation for commercial accounts shall be established by Resolution of the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Findings. The VRSD Board of Directors finds the foregoing fees and charges are for the purpose of: 1) meeting operating expenses, including employees wage rates and fringe benefits; 2) purchasing or leasing supplies, equipment, or materials; 3) meeting financial reserve needs and requirements; or 4) obtaining funds for solid waste facilities (including opening/closure projects) necessary to maintain service within existing service areas.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective July 1, 2009.

Section 8. Repeal. Ordinance No. VRSD-101 is hereby repealed as of the effective date specified in Section 7 above.

Section 9. Severability. If any term, condition, or provision of this Ordinance is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remainder of the provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect, and shall in no way be affected, impaired, or invalidated thereby.
